Report of the Board of Directors and President/CEO

WCCU had a strong financial year in 2023. We experienced strong loan growth, our yields on investments increased, our reserves remained strong, and we did not experience

Your credit union remains financially strong in all key areas. Assets ended the year at \$441 million, savings at \$398 million, and net loans at \$243 million. Total membership grew to 19,527 - we have 8 branch offices, and 99 employees. The key ratios required by regulators are strong. Capital to Assets was 12.56%, delinquency was controlled at 0.50% and net income ended at 1.39% of total assets.

WCCU weathered the economic impact of rising inflation and rising interest rates quite well. We increased our savings and CD rates to be very competitive within our markets and we did so while keeping our loan rates low. Our reserve (equity) position remains strong and growing.

Loan rates and investment yields increased in 2023 due to the Federal Reserve raising rates. Although we did increase loan rates, we did not increase nearly as quickly as other financial institutions. Our rates are still below the average rates in the market. The higher yields on loans and investments did result in a stronger bottom line. That net income is needed when the credit union is growing. Our member savings declined slightly by 3.55%. WCCU again maintained good control of operating expenses.

The credit union's current and future financial condition is always in mind when setting strategic direction. The best overall interest of the credit union is considered when making decisions regarding products, services, pricing, rates, and fees. WCCU strives to deliver products and services in a convenient and timely manner at a reasonable cost. Our service offerings continue to expand with the technology that is available (and demanded) by our members. We are committed to growth and to remain a strong financial institution that will meet the future demands of the membership ensuring WCCU is empowering our members for success.

We are a community credit union in western North Dakota and feel it is important to be involved in the communities where we conduct business. It is with great pride that we give back to our communities through financial donations and spending time in volunteer activities.

The Board of Directors, Supervisory Committee, Managers and Employees will stay focused on the safety and soundness of your credit union. WCCU has a strong team of committed individuals and loyal members. Thank you for your membership and support of Western Cooperative Credit Union and for choosing us as your financial institution.
